

Project overview

Morecambe Offshore Windfarm is a proposed offshore windfarm located in the east Irish Sea. It's anticipated to generate a nominal capacity of 480 megawatts (MW) and produce renewable power for over 500,000 homes in the United Kingdom (UK). At its nearest point, the windfarm site is approximately 30 kilometres (km) from the shore of the Lancashire coast. The windfarm will help the UK to achieve its target of generating 50 gigawatts (GW) of power from offshore wind by 2030.

The Morecambe Offshore Windfarm Generation Assets are expected to include:

- Up to 40 wind turbine generators (WTGs)
- Up to two offshore substation platforms (OSPs)
- Platform link (interconnector) cables
- Inter-array cables

WTGs and OSPs will be fixed to the seabed with foundation structures. The electricity generated by the WTGs would be transported to the National Grid via the Transmission Assets project (together with transmission infrastructure for the Morgan Offshore Wind Project). The Transmission Assets project is the subject of a separate application for consent. This form focuses on gaining feedback in relation to the Morecambe Offshore Windfarm Generation Assets project.
